DC Public Libraries During the Covid-19 Pandemic

Public libraries are reopening along with DC's phases. Currently, under **Phase 2**, public libraries are open only for limited takeout services. These services include returning materials, picking up a hold, checking out books from their Grab-n-Go selection, getting a library card, and picking up a remote print job. There will be a pick-up station at the door of each library with staff to assist you.

Remote printing allows customers to send documents electronically for printing at the following libraries: Anacostia, Bellevue, Benning, Capitol View, Cleveland Park, Francis A. Gregory, Mt. Pleasant, Northeast, Petworth, Shaw, Shepherd Park, Tenley-Friendship, West End and Woodridge. You can email your print job (up to 20 pages per day) to the branch location for pick-up.
